

Isaiah 58:1-3

"Shout it aloud, do not hold back, Raise your voice like a trumpet.

Declare to my people their rebellion and to the descendants of Jacob their sins.

2 For day after day they seek me out; they seem eager to know my ways,
as if they were a nation that does what is right and has not forsaken the commands of its God.

They ask me for just decisions and seem eager for God to come near them.

3 'Why have we fasted,' they say, 'and you have not seen it?

Why have we humbled ourselves, and you have not noticed?'

Acts 13:42-48

42 As Paul and Barnabas were leaving the synagogue,
the people invited them to speak further about these things on the next Sabbath.

43 When the congregation was dismissed,
many of the Jews and devout converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who talked with
them and urged them to continue in the grace of God.

44 On the next Sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord.
45 When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy.
They began to contradict what Paul was saying and heaped abuse on him.

46 Then Paul and Barnabas answered them boldly:
"We had to speak the word of God to you first.
Since you reject it and do not consider yourselves worthy of eternal life,
we now turn to the Gentiles. 47
For this is what the Lord has commanded us:
"'I have made you a light for the Gentiles,

that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth.

48 When the Gentiles heard this, they were glad and honored the word of the Lord; and all who were appointed for eternal life believed.



J. Elisha "Eli" Burke grew up in rural northeastern North Carolina in an area with little local access to medical care and prevention. Dr. Burke is a Richmond resident has been involved in health promotion initiatives to improve the health of underserved populations, particularly African Americans since 1994. As an active board member for several health organizations,

he is often the non-scientist helping health agencies understand the perspectives of the poor and marginalized as an essential part of their efforts to improve health outcomes for all citizens. As an ordained minister, former pastor and currently a nonprofit director and Interim Ministry Specialist he is focused on Christian Education as the foundation for taking care of ourselves – body, mind and spirit. He is the author of Faith Beyond the Pews: An Experience in Christian Education.

Jackson's Rainbow PUSH Coalition from 1997 to 2007 in Chicago, IL; a Teaching Fellow of a course on Coalition Politics at the Harvard's Kennedy School of Government in Cambridge, MA; a public policy analyst at the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights Under Law in Washington, DC; a special assistant to Virginia Governor Lawrence Douglas Wilder; and executive director of the Old Dominion Bar Association in the Commonwealth of Virginia. As an analyst, academic, and activist, and author he has helped to define the critical issues of his time on television and radio—both domestically and internationally. Gary Flowers is a native of Richmond, VA and fiercely committed to family, friends, and faith. Gary has a passion for social justice and an obsession for improving the human condition through understanding and information.

Pastor, Ebenezer Baptist Church, Beaverdam, VA



Dr. John W. Kinney has devoted himself to the pursuit of excellence in theological training and ministerial preparation and has distinguished himself as a systematic theologian, academician and administrator in a career that spans over 35 years. He received undergraduate and graduate degrees from Marshall University, Huntington, West Virginia and Virginia Union University in Richmond, Virginia respectively. He was awarded the Ph.D. from Columbia University/Union Theological Seminary in New York. He has also shared in instruction at Chicago Theology Seminary, Chicago, Illinois; Randolph Macon

College, Ashland, Virginia; Union Theological Seminary, Richmond, Virginia; and the College of William and Mary, Williamsburg, Virginia. He is recognized for his theological constructions addressing the designed harmony in creation and the subsequent fragmentation and separation with particular attention to racism, sexism and materialism. His thoughts are included in several publications and crystallized in Baptists against Racism in an article entitled The Theology of Fallenness: The Roots of Racism.

Dr. Kinney's commitment to the needs of the community at large is apparent by his avid participation in several professional societies and organizations. Dr. Kinney has served as a consultant to the American Baptist Convention, the Progressive National Baptist Convention, the Baptist General Convention of Virginia and both the United States Air Force, Army and Navy Chaplain Corps. He has been a member of the American Society of Church History, the American Academy of Religion and the Society for the Study of Black Religion. He has served the larger community of theological educators through multiple leadership roles in the Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada. Dr. Kinney chaired the committee on Race and Ethnicity from 1998 to 2000. He served as a member on the Commission on Accrediting for the Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada from 2000 to 2006 and actively continued as Commission Chair (2004-2006), Vice President (2006-2008), President (2008-2010) and Personnel Committee Chair (2010-2012). His service to academia is complimented by his service to the parish. Dr. Kinney has served as the pastor of the Ebenezer Baptist Church in Beaverdam, Virginia for more than 35 years.

Dr. Jessica Young Brown is a licensed clinical psychologist who works as clinician, educator, consultant, and speaker. She is Assistant Professor of Psychology at Virginia Commonwealth University. There she teaches in applied psychology and coordinates undergraduate internship experiences. Her research and clinical work focus on making mental health accessible and equitable for people in marginalized communities and equipping mental health professionals to better serve these communities. Dr. Brown's areas of consultation include the impact of racism

and race-related stress on mental health, transgenerational and cultural trauma, and the intersection of faith and mental health. In addition to various peer reviewed and popular media articles, Dr. Brown is the author of Making Space at the Well: Mental Health and the Church.

Rev. Dr. Heber Brown, III



Rev. Dr. Heber Brown, III has been a catalyst for personal and social change for more than twenty years. From 2008 - 2022, he served as Senior Pastor of Pleasant Hope Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland. In 2015 he launched the Black Church Food Security Network a national alliance of more than 200 congregations that work together to co-create Black food ecosystems anchored by Black churches in partnership with Black farmers and producers. Dr. Brown's dedication to service has been widely recognized. He is the

recipient of numerous awards including the Ella Baker Freedom Fighter Award and The Afro American Newspaper's "25 Under 40 Emerging Black History Leaders" award. In 2011, Urbanite Magazine identified him as one of the "Change Makers of Baltimore City." In 2018, Baltimore Magazine named him a Visionary of the City and the Baltimore City Office of Civil Rights presented him with their Food Justice Award. In 2019, he received the coveted Emerging Leaders Award from the Claneil Foundation which brought with it a \$250,000 investment in the work of the Black Church Food Security Network. In 2021, Rev. Dr. Brown was inducted into the Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Preachers at Morehouse College. In 2022, he was chosen to become an Ashoka Fellow - which places him among some of the most influential social entrepreneurs around the world. In 2023, he received Humanitarian Awards from both the Samuel DeWitt Proctor Conference and the Morgan State University Baltimore Alumni Chapter. That year, he also received the Community Service Award from the Epsilon Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated. In 2024, he received the Locke Innovative Leader Award and the Invested Faith Fellowship which identifies faith-rooted individuals who are working to change unjust systems. He earned his B.S. degree in Psychology from Morgan State University, a Master of Divinity degree from Virginia Union University and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Wesley Theological Seminary. (Washington, D.C.). He serves on the board of many impactful organizations such as Bread for The World and is the author of the forthcoming book, Nothing More Sacred: Radical Stories of Black Church Faith. Food and Freedom.

Rev. Dr. Kenneth D. Cooper is an ordained minister and preacher of the Gospel of his Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ. He has preached to God's children from the United States to Africa and South America. Dr. Kenneth D. Cooper transitioned to full-time ministry in 2006, as the Minister to Missions at Fountain Baptist Church in New Jersey in Summit, New Jersey. In that role, Dr. Cooper offered leadership to Fountain Baptist's ministries in South Africa and the United States. He was also responsible for partnering with Lott Carey Foreign Missions Convention to develop, implement and manage the

church's one-million dollars Hurricane Katrina recovery project. Dr. Cooper served as the Senior Pastor of Christian Faith Baptist Church in Raleigh, North Carolina. Under his leadership, the men of Christian Faith raised twenty-thousand dollars for an African American male student at the Historical Black College and University of North Carolina Central University. In January 2019, Dr. Cooper was called to serve and proudly serves as the Senior Pastor of Spring Creek Baptist Church in Moseley, Virginia. Reverend Dr. Kenneth D. Cooper holds a Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering from New Jersey Institute of Technology, where he was awarded a full academic scholarship by the Black Engineers Technology Alumni Association. He also has a Master of Divinity degree from Drew

University School of Theology. With a keen understanding of pastoral work, Dr. Cooper attended Monmouth University School of Social Work where he earned his Master of Social Work degree. In addition to providing pastoral leadership, Dr. Cooper enrolled in the Global Leadership program at Virginia Union University Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology where he received his Doctor of Ministry degree. His concentration was Twenty-first Century Global Missional Leadership.

Dr. Cooper was born and raised in Newark, New Jersey. He is married to the former Reverend LaKeeyna S. Sims, they have two children, D'Shaun C. Cooper, and Kennedy A. Cooper. Dr. Cooper's lifetime mantra is "Healthy Body, Healthy Mind and Healthy Spirit."

Rev. Dr. Gina C. Jacobs-Strain was called as General Secretary of American Baptist Churches USA by the Board of General Ministries on November 4, 2023, and her service in this role began on February 1, 2024.

Dr. Jacobs-Strain's devotion to the Lord began in her elementary school years when she committed her life to Christ. She served as Executive Director of American Baptist Women's Ministries (ABWM) for six years. Under her guidance, ABWM introduced the

AB GIRLS program, "Building Bridges and Gateways to Girl's Future/Hie-STEAM," an initiative connecting AB GIRLS Christian Curriculum with local STEAM providers, empowering girls to recognize God's creative potential within them. ABWM has also broadened its Beloved Community and Domestic Violence ministries and now offers seminars and webinars tailored for young adult women nationwide. Dr. Jacobs-Strain has held various pastoral roles including Transitional Pastor at First Baptist Church of New Market in Piscataway, N.J., Interim Pastor at St. Paul Baptist Church in Atlantic Highlands, N.J., Associate Regional Pastor for Women in Ministry for American Baptist Churches of New Jersey (ABC-NJ), and serves as an Associate Minister of Christian Education at St. Paul Baptist Church in Montclair, N.J. Rev. Jacobs-Strain has served as a guest speaker, preacher, workshop leader and Bible study leader for ABWM regions, ABC regions and ABCUSA. She has also been a guest preacher/lecturer at institutions such as Drew University Theological School, New

Empowering Conversations Leaders/Presenters Goldie Smith Byrd, Ph.D.



A Magnolia, North Carolina native, Dr. Goldie S. Byrd is the founder of the Center for Outreach in Alzheimer's, Aging and Community Health (COAACH) at North Carolina Agricultural & Technical State University (NCAT). Dr. Byrd finished NCAT for her undergraduate studies, where she earned not one but two bachelor's degrees. She went on to Meharry Medical College to earn her Ph.D. in microbiology a er she was encouraged to do so by her mentors. Dr. Byrd became a professor of biology at NCAT in 2003. She eventually became the university's first female chair of the Department of Biology, as well

as the first permanent female dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. During her me as the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at NCAT, Dr Byrd founded the Center for Outreach in Alzheimer's Aging and Community Health (COAACH) to complement her genetics of Alzheimer's in African Americans research. COAACH is a cross-disciplinary community engaged center funded by the university and corporate partnerships. Dr. Byrd's research is published in esteemed, peer-reviewed journals and has been recognized by the Alzheimer's Association. Dr. Byrd was particular about COAACH catering to the African American community because African Americans have an increased risk of being diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease. Dr. Byrd stepped down from her position as COAACH's executive director in 2019, but still stands as COAACH's honorable founder. Dr. Byrd now works as the director of the Maya Angelou Center for Health Equity, which is located at Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center. Dr. Goldie S Byrd is Professor of Public Health Sciences and Director of the Maya Angelou Center for Health Equity at Wake Forest School of Medicine. She is the former Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Chair of Biology, and the Nathan F Simms Endowed Distinguished Professor of Biology at North Carolina A&T State University. Dr Byrd has received numerous awards for her leadership, research and service, including the Leadership-North Carolina Stanley Frank Leadership Award, the Presidential Award for Excellence in Science Mathema cs and Engineering Mentoring (PAESMEM) which was received at a White House ceremony, and most recently she was recognized by Governor Roy Cooper as a Health Equity Champion for the State. Dr Byrd has served on panels, ad hoc groups and advisory boards. Appointed by the NC Secretary of Health and Human Services, she recently co-chaired the state's COVID-19 Vaccine Advisory Committee.

Rev. Emily Carroll, currently serves as the Pastor of the Shady Grove United Methodist Church, Mansfield, Louisiana; she has often found herself situated in the warmth of other suns. Late Evening Worship Preacher Dr. Kevin Sykes



Dr. Kevin Sykes, a native of Virginia Beach, Virginia, is the youngest of four children born to Mrs. Jean Sykes in Salon, France. After relocating to the Richmond area at the age of nineteen he was employed in several management positions which helped to further develop his leadership skills. With his interest in Marketing and Business, he enrolled and attended Virginia State University. After about two years on this academic track, God intervened and redirected his path. Acknowledging God's call to the ministry, Dr. Sykes returned to Virginia Beach, and under the leadership of his Pastor, the late Bishop William D. Scott, Sr. of the Pleasant Grove Baptist Church was licensed to preach

the gospel in June 1990. In December 2003, Dr. Sykes accepted the call to become the Senior Pastor and 15th Administration of the St. James Baptist Church (Varina). He served as the former Pastor of the Ebenezer Baptist Church (Supply, Virginia) for seven years. In October 2015, Governor Terry McAuliffe appointed him to serve on the State Board of Corrections, and in 2018 under the new administration of Governor Ralph Northam, he was reappointed and served until June 2021. A true and dedicated servant of the Word, Dr. Sykes is deeply committed to his calling with a passion and love for people and ministry and proclaiming the good news of Jesus Christ. Under his leadership at St. James, through the divine leading of the Holy Spirit, he introduced and revitalized several ministries of the church. One of the most remarkable accomplishments occurred in 2012 when the church became a debt-free congregation after \$650,000 in capital debt was eliminated. As he leads the people to a higher dimension in ministry, God has favored him and his ministry to also continue growing the church with committed and devoted leaders and disciples. In 2018, God gave Pastor Sykes the vision for a multi-million-dollar administrative wing and renovation of the existing sanctuary expansion plan that was presented and approved by the congregation. Thursday Bible Study Teacher Yung Suk Kim, Ph.D.



Prof. of New Testament & Early Christianity, Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology Yung Suk Kim is Professor of New Testament and Early Christianity at Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology, Virginia Union University. Dr. Kim is committed to transformative teaching, indomitable scholarship, and effective public service. He has a passion for human transformation, rooted in self-knowledge and self-criticism. Traveling to many Latin American countries during his business career, he learned a great deal about cultural diversity and the need for human solidarity. What does it mean to live in this world

with each other (i.e., the meaning of the Other, which resonates with Emmanuel Levinas' "the face of the other," Paul Ricoeur's "inter-subjective narrative identity," and Jacques Derrida's "relationless relation")? How can we do theology in our thoughts and deeds, while moving pointedly away from individualism? And how can we read biblical stories with each other when we differ? Dr. Kim received a PhD in New Testament study from Vanderbilt University and an M. Div from McCormick Theological Seminary. He was a recipient of the Lilly Theological Scholars Grant for research on John's Gospel in the context of pluralism. He also received a research fellowship from Wabash Center for research on the Bible and transformation. Dr. Kim received a presidential citation for outstanding service and unselfish commitment from the VUU. In 2019, he received the Scott & Stringfellow Outstanding Professor Award from the VUU. Dr. Kim is the author of more than 16 books, including Christ's Body in Corinth: The Politics of a Metaphor (Fortress, 2008) and Toward Decentering the New Testament (Cascade, 2018, co-authored with Mitzi J. Smith). This is the first introductory text to the New Testament written by an African American woman biblical scholar (Mitzi J. Smith) and an Asian-American male biblical scholar. He also edited 1-2 Corinthians: Texts @ Contexts Series (Fortress, 2013). His most recent book is How to Read Paul: A Brief Introduction to his Theology, Writings, and World (Fortress, 2021).
